BIC students receive a transcript from Jacksonville University, Florida accrediting their full course load.

While our intensive Spanish classes will give you the skills and confidence to immerse yourself in the local culture and make the most of your study abroad experience, the BIC program offers you the added benefit of fulfilling university academic requirements with specially designed courses in International Business, the Humanities and more. The classes are mostly taught in English, with some courses taught in Spanish at a level for students who don't have Spanish as a first language.

Both the electives and Spanish language courses are taught by the best local and international professors Barcelona has to offer, all of them with experience teaching to international students.

Academic Options

BIC's flexibility through various study options allows students to tailor their curriculum. Options include studying during the fall semester, spring semester, the full academic year, or during one of two summer terms.

Academic Requirements

- Students must have a minimum of a cumulative
 2.5 GPA (of a 4.0 scale) or equivalent.
- No previous Spanish language is required.

International Business Focus at BIC

In addition to language and humanities, the BIC also focuses on International Business course options for students. Classes range from general International Business to International Marketing, cross-cultural issues in management and more. Many universities choose BIC for customized programs for their international business departments.

The International Business curriculum is developed and taught by professors who come from the world of business and have experience teaching at some of the top Business schools in Barcelona and globally.

Liberal Arts and Humanities Focus at BIC

BIC works hard on behalf of the students to offer a variety of courses in Liberal Arts and Humanities so students will have no trouble finding classes to count towards their graduation requirements. The courses in Liberal Arts and Humanities cover History, International Relations, Politics, Cultural Studies, Global Studies and more.

Spanish Language Focus at BIC

Spanish language acquisition is a top priority for the staff at BIC and we encourage language development in every aspect of the program. From beginner to advanced levels, most semester students will take an intensive Spanish course worth 3 U.S. credits, plus three or four

electives worth 3 U.S. credits each. Summer students will choose from the following: an intensive Spanish language course worth 6 U.S. credits; or Spanish language class worth 3 U.S. credits plus one 3-credit elective; or two electives in English worth 3 U.S. credits each. The variety of options offer students everything they could want!

Small language classes mean that students get intensive Spanish practice with their peers and teachers. Interaction with staff in Spanish, extra-curricular activities, and weekly tutoring all provide out-of-class opportunities to enhance Spanish language progress that would not take place on your home campus.

Catalan Language Option at BIC

Catalan lessons are available to introduce students to the history, politics, language, and unique culture of Catalonia, particularly in relation to Spain. The environment of Catalonia will help the students take a look at modern day Catalonia and glance back to see what events and people have shaped the nation to make it what it is today. Students will be asked to interact and analyze their own experiences with Catalan culture, not only to reflect on the differences between the rest of Spain, but also between their own values and culture.

Accommodation

Home stay

A home stay can be a meaningful path towards cultural integration and language immersion during the study abroad experience. Home stays are designed to be a mutually valuable experience for both the hosts and the participant. We work to find home stays who want to share their culture and language with the students and create a warm atmosphere.

Home stays include breakfast and dinner every day (except excursions), laundry service once a week, and a set of keys to the apartment for coming and going as you please.

Students share double rooms but can secure an individual room for an extra fee.

Apartments

Living in an apartment in Barcelona provides students with a very realistic experience of life in the city. Apartments are fully equipped shared living spaces that Barcelona International College students may live in jointly with other students – American or international.

The apartments are spread throughout the city in safe areas with easy access to public transportation, restaurants, and shops.

Students share double rooms but can secure an individual room or private apartment for an extra fee.

Students who choose to live in an apartment do not get meals included but have kitchen and cooking facilities.

Residence Halls

Students may choose to live in a beautiful, brandnew residence hall located in the city center; there is no better location to in the city to live with just a 5 minute walk to Paseo de Grácia – the majestic boulevard of Barcelona. The residence hall is filled with other international students and young professionals, includes shared cooking facilities, a café, a swimming pool and quiet places to study. Securing a place in a residence hall is not easy due to limited space and an extra fee applies to this option.

Girona and the Dalí Museum

Girona, located midway between the sea and the mountains, is one of the most evocative historical centres in Catalonia, with certain elements that are unique to Europe. Not far from here, in the town of Figueres, is the Dalí Museum, the largest surrealistic object in the world containing the widest range of works spanning the artist's career.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Send in the paper application or apply on-line
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) or equivalent.
- Submit an official transcript from your college or university
- \$250.00 non-refundable application fee

REFUND POLICY

- Barcelona International College (BIC) utilizes a rolling admission process.
- Once a program is full, applications will no longer be accepted.
- Full payment is due 30 days prior to the program start date, unless otherwise specified by Barcelona International College.
- Due to pre-program financial commitments, Barcelona SAE does not make exceptions to the refund policy, therefore, the \$250.00 deposit is non-refundable.
- Barcelona International College BIC reserves the right to increase the price of the program at any time if there are any significant inflationary price increases or changes in the exchange rate.
- If, for any reason, the student withdraws from the program:
 - Before the payment due date, then the student is eligible for a full refund of the program cost minus the non-refundable deposit.
 - After the payment due date but before the program start date, then the student is eligible for a 50% program cost refund minus the non-refundable deposit.
 - 3. After the program start date, then there is no refund.

Note: Students who have not paid in full by the program due date must pay a \$150.00 fee for late payment. There are no exceptions.

TRAVEL VISAS

- Students who are required to obtain the appropriate travel visa for their stay in Spain must provide a copy of the visa to Barcelona International College.
- If the visa is denied, the student is required to provide a copy of the visa rejection letter. Once the rejection letter is received, normal refund rules apply.
- Students from western Europe do not require a visa to enter Spain.

ADMISSION OR EXPULSION

- Barcelona International College (BIC) reserves the right to cancel the student's place if on the day of their arrival they or their agency have not paid the total sum of the program.
- In the case of a serious disciplinary offence, repeated bad behavior or infringement of the laws of the country in which the course is taking place, the student will be expelled from the school and accommodation contracted with Barcelona International College (BIC) without the right to any refund.
